the famed reform debates at al azhar madrasa in nineteenth century cairo one of the most influential centres of religious study in sunni islam were enormously influential for twentieth century islamic thought here indira gesink offers a revisionist history of these debates over curricular and administrative reforms and challenges our understanding of the struggle between islamic reform and conservatism it has been assumed that famous islamic modernists such as muhammad abduh instigated the reform movement and the ideas of modern religious life that emanated from al azhar and permeated islamic society a development that religious conservatives opposed gesink draws on religious and politics

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important archival sources legal manuals and ephemeral journals to tell the other side of the story and to illustrate the important contributions of conservative scholars to the evolution of twentieth century sunni islam conservative opponents of reform engaged many of the same issues as reformers and actively pursued alternative visions of reform in fact texts of enacted reforms show greater attention to concerns of conservatives than to the original programmes of muhammad abduh and conservatives led ulama committees that generated and implemented reforms had religious conservatives not contributed to the reforms of the early twentieth century these reforms would have lacked the crucial cultural assonance that permitted them to become rooted in public life in an environment of rising nationalist anti british sentiment which saw abduh as a willing agent of colonialists the debates ultimately catalyzed public acceptance of secularism islamic modernism and radical islamism they also led to the practice of lay legal interpretation the proliferation of competing interpretations within sunni islam and the rise of militant sects by drawing on obscure archival sources and restoring conservative voices to the debate islamic reform and conservatism presents a more nuanced picture of the al azhar debates and the forces that shaped islamic religious life in the twentieth century than has become the norm its original scholarship and fresh analysis make this book indispensable for all those interested in the modern middle east religious history islamic studies radical islam and militancy secularism modernism and religious reform

this study aims to examine the impact of al azhar university in cairo the arab republic of egypt on arabic islamic schools in the yorubaland nigeria this is done through investigation of its curriculum and of al azhar's delegates teaching in arabic islamic schools in yorubaland nigeria it discusses islamic religious affairs and the role played by the nigerian muslim scholars in general and in the south western nigeria in particular furthermore it addresses the arguments on the need to pursue religious education within and outside the country this study also examines the differences between al azhar and the nigerian arabic islamic educational systems and investigates the need for continuation or otherwise of al azhar's venture in the nigerian arabic islamic schools this study is both historical and analytical in nature it used data gathered via primary and secondary sources such as books interviewing some scholars in nigeria and distribution of questionnaire to nigerian students in egypt findings from this study revealed the suitability of al azhar educational system for nigeria it also showed the continuous need to pursue al azhar education by nigerians there was also emphasis on introducing some western courses into al

azhar educational curriculum the study recommends the completion of secondary education in nigeria by intending nigerians seeking al azhar education in egypt in order to facilitate their usefulness in the nigerian western oriented educational system upon their return

A Passage to France 1976-01-01

a widely respected legal scholar islamist activist and renowned host of al jazeera s most popular religious program sharia and life yusuf al qaradawi is an extremely controversial figure in contemporary islamism when he was a young man qaradawi attended a lecture by hassan al banna founder of the muslim brotherhood and immediately joined the organization s youth wing after earning his degree in theology at al azhar university in cairo qaradawi settled in qatar where he played a pivotal role in establishing a system of islamic higher education when the muslim brotherhood was forced underground in the 1960s qaradawi eschewed a formal position with the movement opting instead to pursue a career as a major writer and ideologist of contemporary islamist thought beginning in the mid 1970s qaradawi became one of a handful of islamist ulama muslim scholars who were accepted as authorities on doctrinal and political matters both by islamists and within the wider islamic resurgence bettina gräf and jakob skovgaard petersen provide the first book length treatment of yusuf al qaradawi in english since the 1990s qaradawi has cleverly exploited new media to reach a global audience he was one of the first sunni scholars to launch his own site and is heavily involved with islam online having just celebrated the ten year anniversary of sharia and life qaradawi is unquestionably the most important sunni religious figure in the world today and these essays initiate readers into his immensely influential speeches and thought
